**A Joyful Sunday.** The Fourth Sunday of Lent is also known as ***Laetare Sunday***. *Laetare* is a Latin word which means “rejoice” or “rejoicing.” Other nuances of the word include joyfulness, gladness, cheerfulness, and happiness. This elated or jubilant mood is a striking one-day departure from the somber, sorrowful, penitential tone of the other days of Lent.

**Joyful Anticipation.** There are multiple reasons why the Fourth Sunday of Lent is cause for joy, the most important of which is the proximity of Easter. On Ash Wednesday Easter was a long way off, six and a half weeks, but on the Fourth Sunday of Lent, Easter is only three weeks away, and as the greatest of all Christian feast draws ever nearer, joy increases. Joy is also on the upswing because the amount of time left with the rigors of the Lenten discipline, penitential practices like fasting, abstinence, and self-denial, is more than half over.

## Gospel

Luke 15:1-3, 11-32

Religious people often criticized Jesus for eating and associating with sinners. But these people did not realize that everyone needs God's mercy and love. In today's gospel story, Jesus wants us to know what God's mercy is like. When anyone sins and is sorry for that sin, God rushes out at top speed to embrace that person. Even when we feel that we may be undeserving of God's love, Jesus tells us that God rejoices like the father in the gospel story.

A dramatic reading or acting-out of this gospel story can help us understand its message. Have you ever had the experience of being forgiven or "taken back" into your family or group of friends?

Have you ever forgiven someone who really hurt you? (How did it feel to be acting so much like God?)

Consider the elder brother. Have you ever felt that someone else in your family or among your friends "has it better" or easier than you do? Are you tempted to compare yourself with others? Each child in a family is different. Sometimes, to meet each child's needs, parents cannot treat each child the same. How did the father in this parable meet the needs of each of his sons? How does God meet your needs?

*Pray: Jesus, during this Lenten season, help me to ask for forgiveness. Help me to forgive generously as God does. Help me to celebrate that I am God's child. I do not have to compare myself with others. My needs are being met as God knows best. Amen.*
