As part of the Jubilee Year of Mercy, this Mass will be celebrated by Bishop John Stowe, OFM Conv., Bishop of Lexington, with specific petitions for the spiritual healing of families. The Sacrament of Reconciliation will be offered from 10:30am-11:45am, with Eucharistic exposition and adoration immediately following Mass.

This event is inspired by three realities:

1. The family is the "domestic Church," a fundamental building block of the Body of Christ--where we encounter some of the most basic and profound lessons about life and love, faith and virtue.
2. The family is wounded and in need of ongoing grace, affected by challenges from without and within, and beset by division, jealousies, stress, physical and mental illnesses, conflict, violence, addiction, infidelities, anger, and unforgiveness.
3. The Mass is the Church's supreme prayer, in which the saving work of Christ's Paschal Mystery is made present anew in our midst through the Eucharistic sacrifice. As Jesus himself said, "Those who are well have no need of a physician, but those who are sick; I came not to call the righteous, but sinners" (Mark 2:17).

### Gospel Reflection

[John 3:14-21](#)

In teaching Nicodemus, Jesus uses a familiar story from the Old Testament (Numbers 21:4-9) about Moses. When Moses lifted up a bronze snake in the desert for all to see, those who had been bitten by snakes were healed. Jesus says that he too must be lifted up so that all might have eternal life through him. He will be lifted up on the cross. But he will also be lifted up in his resurrection and in his ascension to the Father. Whoever looks at him in faith will receive eternal life.

Followers of Jesus recognize him as the light that came into the world. They live truthfully in the light, unlike those who choose the darkness and do evil deeds.

Picture the entire world today as a patient in a doctor's office. What might the doctor say is wrong with the world's health? List some of the problems Jesus might point out and name some of the ways the followers of Jesus can be healers in our world.

How do members of your family, school community, and parish show that they are living in the light? What can we do to help others choose to live truthfully in the light?

The call of every baptized Christian, anointed as priest, prophet, and king, is to exercise stewardship over the resources we've been blessed with through servant leadership. A servant leader has characteristics that include *having a calling, listening, empathy, healing, and awareness*. **Requesting a Mass to be offered**

The Church considers the Mass the greatest possible prayer of intercession because it is the perfect offering of Christ to the Father by making present the Paschal Mystery of His death and resurrection.

It is a longstanding tradition in the Church that a Priest may be requested to offer a Mass for a specific intention, even when one cannot be physically present at the Mass.

The faithful make a free will offering, called a stipend, to a priest or Religious Community in order to apply the Mass to a specific intention. By making this offering, the faithful, by making their own offering, associate themselves more intimately with Christ who offers Himself in the Sacred Host, and obtain thereby more abundant fruits (refer to Pope Paul VI's letter "Firma in Traditione" of June 13, 1974).
