

Gospel Reflection

John 3:16-18

We often begin Mass with the prayer from today's Epistle: "The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with all of you." We praise the God who has revealed himself as a Trinity, a communion of persons.

Communion with the Trinity is the goal of our worship—and the purpose of the salvation history that begins in the Bible and continues in the Eucharist and sacraments of the Church. We see the beginnings of God's self-revelation in today's First Reading, as He passes before Moses and cries out His holy name.

Israel had sinned in worshipping the golden calf. But God does not condemn them to perish. Instead He proclaims His mercy and faithfulness to His covenant.

God loved Israel as His firstborn son among the nations. Through Israel—heirs of His covenant with Abraham—God planned to reveal himself as the Father of all nations. The memory of God's covenant testing of Abraham—and Abraham's faithful obedience—lies behind today's Gospel.

In commanding Abraham to offer his only beloved son, God was preparing us for the fullest possible revelation of His love for the world.

As Abraham was willing to offer Isaac, God did not spare His own Son but handed Him over for us all. In this, He revealed what was only disclosed partially to Moses—that His kindness continues for a thousand generations, that He forgives our sin, and takes us back as His very own people.

Jesus humbled himself to die in obedience to God's will. And for this, the Spirit of God raised Him from the dead, and gave Him a name above every name. This is the name we glorify—the name of our Lord, the God who is Love.

CONFIRMATION INFORMATION

While summer has just started, we are looking ahead toward our religious education programming for next year. This coming year we want to offer a Confirmation class. This class is for young persons between the ages of 15-20 who have received the sacraments of Baptism and First Eucharist. If you have someone you know or is in your family who is dedicated to receiving this sacrament, please pass along this information. Since the sacrament of Confirmation is celebrated by the Bishop, we must let the diocese know if we will have a class in the coming year so it can be added to his schedule.

Statement on the Sacrament of Confirmation

The Catholic Church of the Diocese of Lexington understands that the sacrament of Confirmation to be a freely given gift of God that perfects Baptismal grace. The life of Christian witness involves ongoing, life-long formation, frequent reception of the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist, an ever-deepening prayer life, and faithful witness of the Good News of Jesus Christ through loving service to all people.

Confirmation is the final rite of initiation for those born into the Catholic faith. In Baptism, children receive forgiveness of original sin and membership to the church, at the bequest of their parents. Next, in receiving the Eucharist at the beginning of their age of reason, they are more fully brought into the body of the church. Confirmation is the step of initiation wherein a young person makes a conscious choice to “put on Christ” in their hearts and in the world, embarking on a life-long journey of Christian mission and fellowship.

In order to receive the sacrament of Confirmation, students must attend class regularly, fulfill a three-part service requirement, and attend a retreat which we will schedule in the spring. We are providing this information at the beginning of summer, giving your young person a “summer of discernment” to be sure that they are dedicated to receiving this sacrament. Again, Bishop John Stowe will be scheduled to administer the sacrament, so a minimal number of dedicated young people will be needed to warrant his trip to our parish. Additionally, due to the size of our parish, we will be offering Confirmation every other year. The next time it will be offered is the fall of 2019.

Our orientation meeting for young people who are in need of receiving the sacrament of Confirmation will be on **August 23rd at 6:00 pm in the OLPH parish hall, so please SAVE THE DATE.** It is important that at least one parent/guardian attend this meeting with their young person. We will be discussing the sacrament and program requirements. Regular class meetings will begin thereafter, meeting at 6:00 pm – 8:00 pm on Wednesday evenings.
